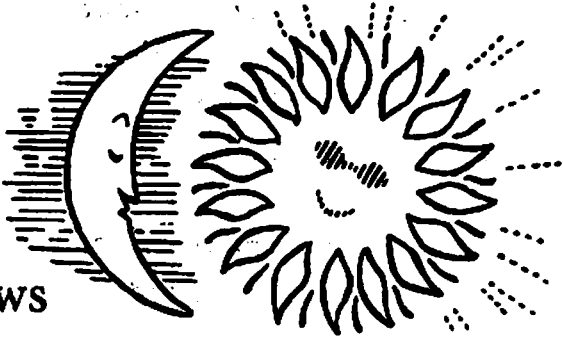

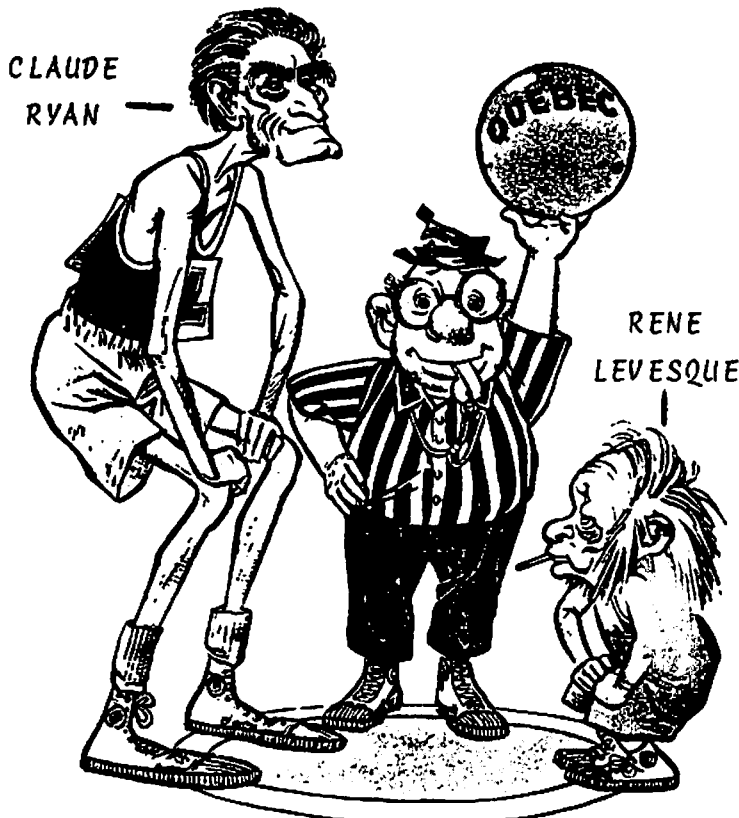
F&SR

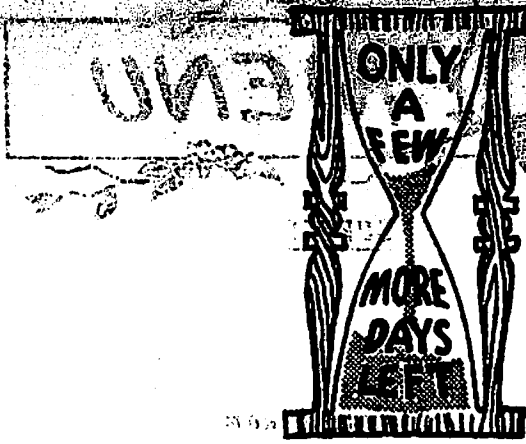

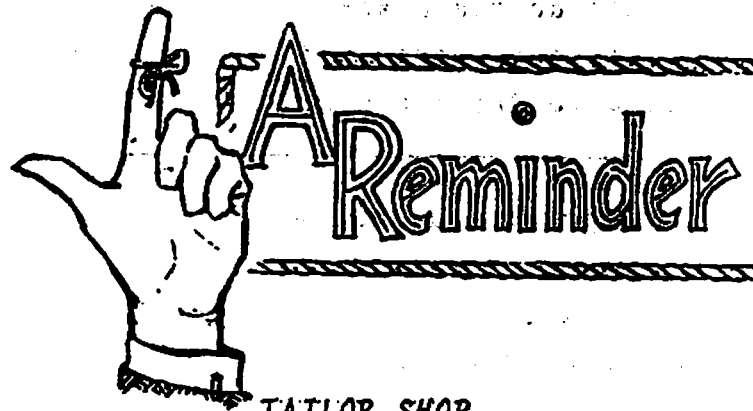
