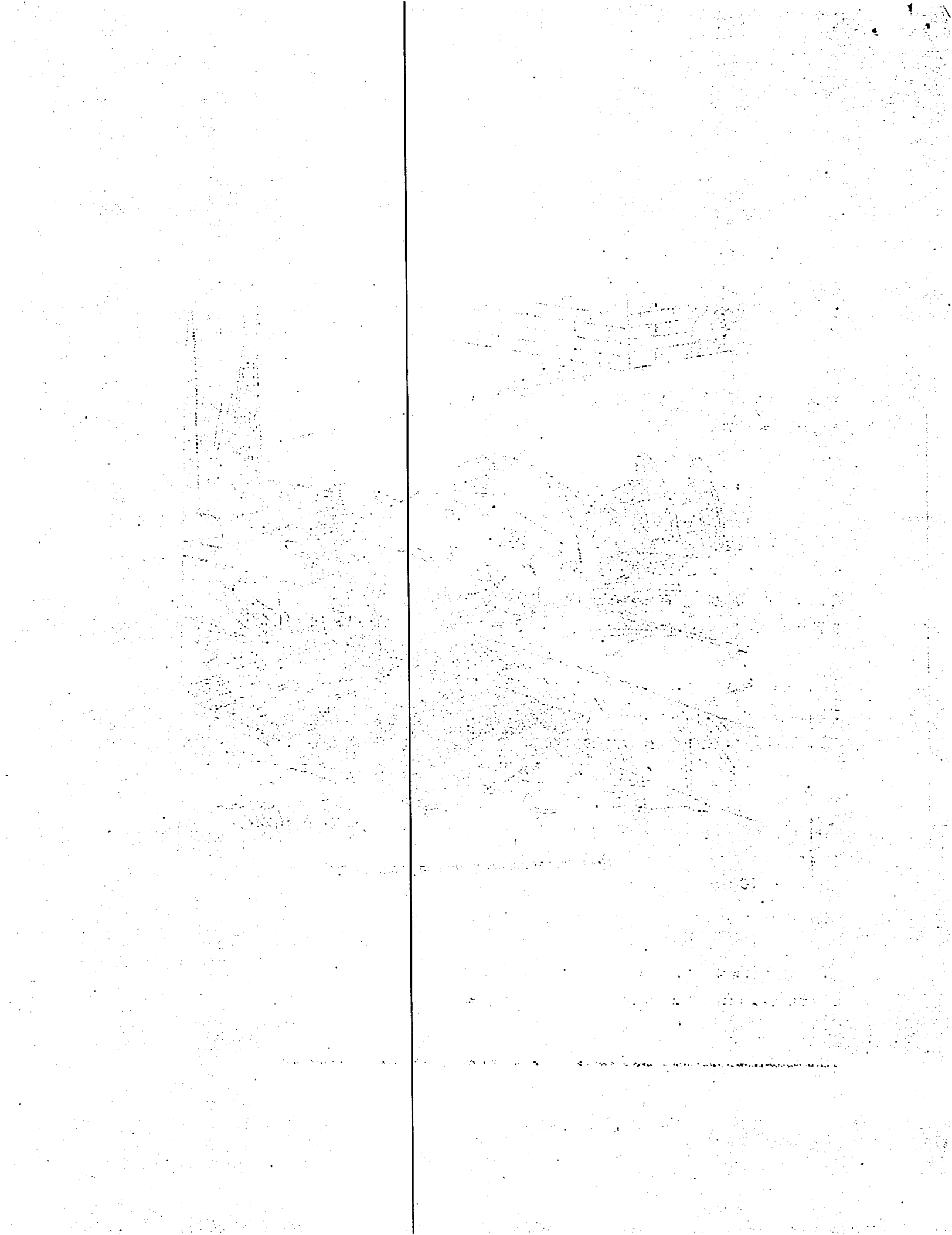



- 21:28 - Keeper telephones MCCP and is advised inmate Cardinal being taken to hospital.
- 21:29 - MCCP calls ~~Cardinal~~ and is advised that inmate Cardinal is enroute to hospital.
- 21:29:25 - Walkway advised by MCCP that Cardinal is enroute.
- 21:29:55 - M9 advises MCCP that med. line is closed.
- 21:30 - Cardinal arrives at hospital
- 21:32:41 - M9 asks MCCP if inmate at med. wicket should be sent back.
- Advised "yes".
- 21:33 - Ambulance service is called.
- Dr. Dyck called.
- 21:37:21 - Keeper advises front gate to let ambulance through when it arrives.
- 21:41:35 - Front gate advises MCCP that the ambulance is inside.
- 21:48:05 - Keeper advises front gate that ambulance is leaving hospital
- 21:49:06 - Ambulance leaves institution.

AN OPINION

There is little rehabilitation in correctional institutions because the prime concern of prison officials is control and security. Prisons are dangerous and violent places, where men are reduced to their own innate cunning and intrinsic brutality to survive. No one has come up with a system whereby, a criminal is both punished and rehabilitated. Prison is a jungle, a place where men are isolated from their families and communities; meaningful work, normal sexual needs, and from any standard of conduct and social motivation that can be a model for reentry into an already suspicious and hostile society.

So the Eagle never gave it another thought. He died thinking he was a barnyard chicken.

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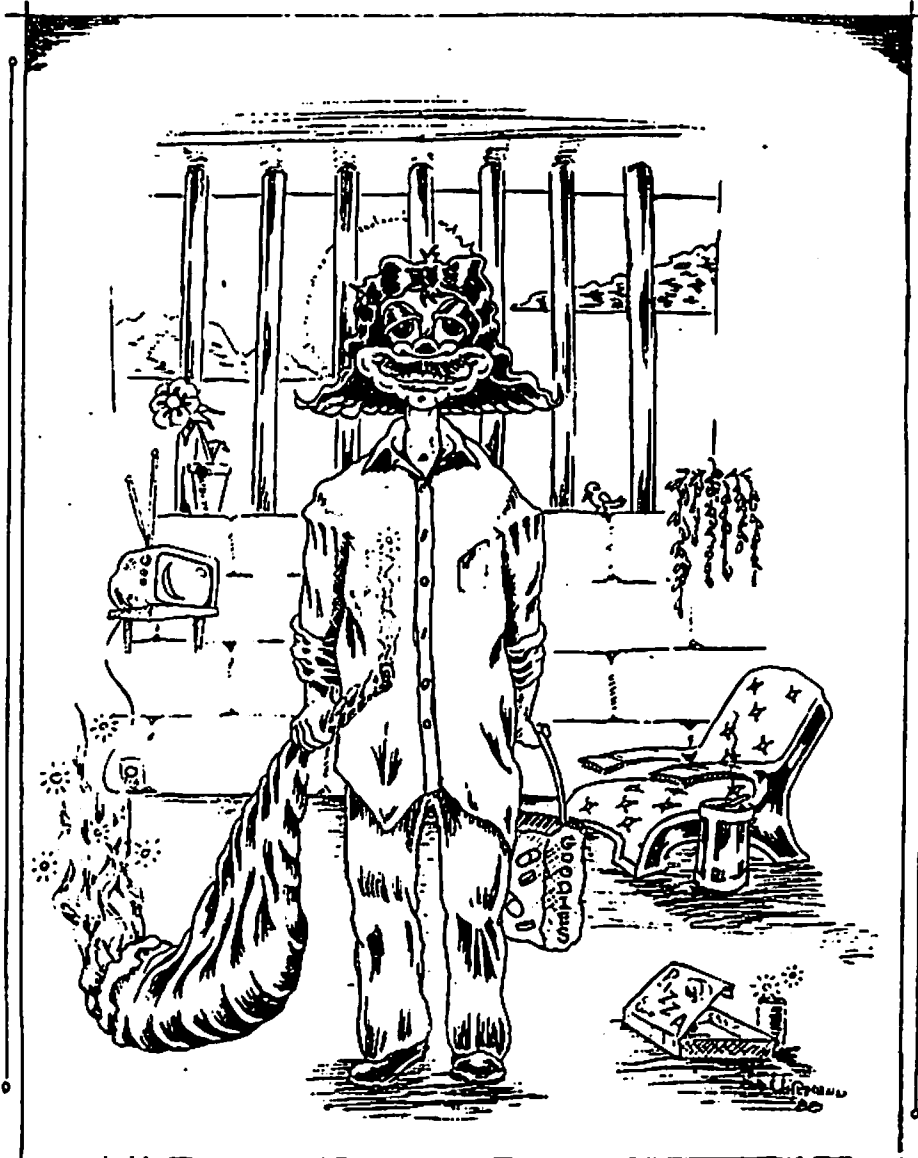

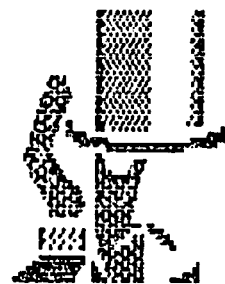
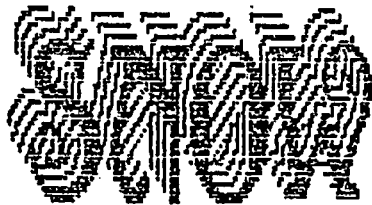

It's only time, she knows.

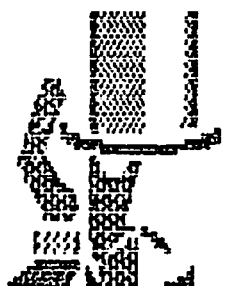

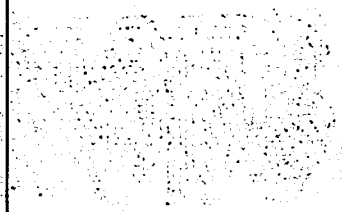
